There was some discussion on a new transportation system in Tarpon Springs. There is a PSTA system called DART (Demand Response Transportation), which not new to the County, but may be new to Tarpon Springs. The system is a shared ride, door-to-door service for people who, because of disability, are unable to independently use the regular, fixed-route bus. See link: http://www.psta.net/dartinfo.php I spoke with Armanda Lampley of Community Development. There is a lot going on in Lealman – more specifically "Central" Lealman (between 34th and 49th Streets). A capital improvement called the Lealman Central Area Drainage project is scheduled land acquisition, project design, and construction of a major drainage program through year 2020. Pond construction to mitigate area flooding (Lealman Area Drainage) is scheduled over the next 2 fiscal years. The phased development of the Joe's Creek Greenway Park continues in 2013. This is the development of a park facility on both sides of Joe's Creek including bank stabilization of the creek, installation of a second pedestrian bridge to complete a circular walking path and the provision of pedestrian access to lands on the north side of the creek.

Several years ago, Community Development conducted a windshield survey of home conditions in the Central Lealman area. This survey was updated by students from USF's Office of Community Engagement. Attached is a discussion of the housing condition evaluation. Furthermore, Community Development is funding a code enforcement officer solely for the Central Lealman area (see attached memo).

Also, the County has in its current Capital Improvement Program, 10 sidewalk projects, 7 of them are part of the Safe Route to School program, where inadequate or missing sidewalk links are addressed. Over the years, many "low-hanging fruit" sidewalk projects; these scheduled projects are higher priced projects.
