STRATEGIC PRIORITIES OVERVIEW

Strategic Issues: the most important issues facing the community; developed by exploring the results of the four MAPP assessments and determining how those issues affect the achievement of the shared vision for community health improvement.

Characteristics of Strategic Issues:

- Pose a threat and/or present an opportunity
- Require a significant change
- Require action on the part of local public health system partners
- Involve conflict between current capabilities and future capacities; actual and desired conditions
- Complex
- Tend to have multiple solutions
- Involve more than one organization
- Project into the future
- Consequence if not addressed
- Must be conditions which participants/local public health system can address (actionable at the local level)

Strategic Issue/Priority Areas: convergence and consolidation of overlapping and related strategic issues.

- 2. Chronic Disease Prevention
- 3. Community Redevelopment and Partnerships
- 4. Access to Care
